HR 676, “Expanded and Improved Medicare for All”

HR 676 would institute a single payer health care system in the U.S. by expanding a greatly improved Medicare to every resident. As of October, 2018, HR 676 has 123 congressional co-sponsors.

HR 676 would cover every person in the U. S—regardless of age, health status or income level-- for all necessary medical care including prescription drugs, hospital, surgical, outpatient services, primary and preventive care, emergency services, dental, mental health, home health, physical therapy, rehabilitation (including for substance abuse), vision care, chiropractic and long term care. HR 676 ends deductibles and co-payments. HR 676 would save billions annually by eliminating the high overhead and profits of the private health insurance industry.
